A Basic Guide to Starting the Peace Education Programme

Choose your course and register with TPRF

- Go to TPRF Peace Education Programme web site to familiarise yourself with what is available and what is required:

- From there go to 'Course Descriptions' to choose the PEP you wish to run:

- The options are PEP1, PEP 2, PEP 3 or PEP Collection (PEP CL). The sessions last from 30 mins to 1 hour depending on the course you choose.
- Apply for a license at TPRF. You will choose between 'Direct' or 'Volunteer'. Apply at least two weeks before you wish to run the course.

Resources

- Arrange for a team of at least two volunteers to run the course, with back up in case of illness.
- Check out the venue for AV and facilities.
E.g. Will you be able to use the internet? Will you use a lap-top or a DVD player? Will you have a screen or a TV? This will determine how you'll play the videos. You will also need a comfortable, neutral environment so people can focus on the PEP themes.
- Once you have your licence, TPRF will let you know how to access the videos and the accompanying materials. You will be asked to fill out a simple online report at the beginning and at the end of the course.
- The videos will be sent to you via the internet. They can be downloaded onto a lap-top, saved to a memory stick or you can buy them as ready-made DVDs in the UK from: <https://printmanuals.co.uk/>
- TPRF will also send you access to the accompanying materials, which consist of:
 - A facilitators manual
 - Workbooks for students – for the beginning of the sessions
 - Handouts for students – for the end of each sessionThese can be downloaded and photocopied or you can purchase them ready made from:

- It is recommended to provide each student with a folder, you may also wish to provide writing materials.
- You will be able to address any queries through TPRF, where lots of support is provided.
